[in the parable of the Prodigal Son] The younger son
represented the poor who failed to keep the law, and the elder
son represented the Pharisees who tried to abide by the law. The
younger son felt he was under a curse because he had failed to
observe the law. The elder son believed that he had earned his father's
favour by being dutiful and observing the law at all times. However,
Jesus said that both sons were mistaken. They presumed that the
father's (i.e. God's) love was conditional and had to be earned by good
behaviour, whereas in actual fact it was a free, unmerited gift. Both
sons were invited to the kind of conversion that leads to a change in
their thinking about their father and to trust in the offer of his
unconditional mercy and love. Whereas the younger son was able to
change his image of his father, the elder son seemed to be unable to
do so.

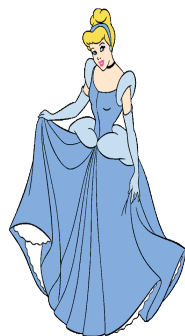
