MUSINGS: Why Pope Francis is happy ...



Question from a young boy during an interview between Pope Francis and young people in 2014: 'Everyone in this world is trying to be happy. But we have wondered are you happy? If so, why?'

Response from Pope Francis: "Absolutely, absolutely, I am happy. And I am happy because ... I don't know why ... perhaps because I'm not unemployed, I have a job— a job as a shepherd! I am happy because I found my path in life and travelling that path makes me happy. And it is also a peaceful happiness, because at my age it is not the same happiness as a young person feels, there's a difference. A certain inner peace, a happiness that also comes with age. And also with a path that has always had problems; even now there are problems, but that happiness doesn't go away with the problems, no: it sees the problems, suffers them and goes on; it does something to resolve them and goes on. But in the depths of my heart there is a peace and a happiness. It is a grace of God, for me, really. It is a grace."
